Kim is a senior educator and epidemiologist (Professor Sport Exercise and Nutrition Education) in the School of Medicine, University of Nottingham. She is a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy.

She is Director of postgraduate education for the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences and Course Director for two masters courses in the School: MSc Sports and Exercise Medicine and MSc Applied Sport and Exercise Medicine. This gives her a very broad knowledge of University processes, assessment and quality assurance of teaching and learning.

In her research she investigates the relationships around physical activity, diet and environmental exposures and their association with chronic disease, such as osteoarthritis, cancer and obesity. She has extensive statistical modelling expertise. She is the Deputy Editor (Statistics) for the European Spine Journal.

Her background whilst highly numerate is not tradition. In brief: maths BSc(Hons); corporate banking career; MMedSci Human Nutrition; spatial epidemiology PhD; then increasingly senior academic roles (University of Leeds; University of Nottingham), teaching and leading research methods and medical statistics and sport and exercise nutrition.
